Our hospital is an economic engine for the local economy:

- Nearly **\$782 million** contributed by Swedish Hospital to the local economy through payroll, capital and other expenses.*
- More than **5,000 direct and indirect full-time jobs**, including 2,000+ directly at Swedish Hospital, many of whom live, shop, spend and volunteer in the local community.*

Additional Community Programs

- Family Connects Chicago at Swedish Hospital provides essential at-home support for new parents in Chicago, at no cost to families who deliver at Swedish Hospital. This program, in collaboration with the Chicago Department of Public Health and Family Connects International, offers comprehensive care including baby and mother health checks, breastfeeding support, and guidance on infant care. Nurses assist with navigating health care and community resources, enhancing family wellbeing and connecting them to vital local services during the critical early weeks with a newborn.
- Swedish Hospital's Food Connections Program addresses food insecurity and promotes health through various initiatives. These include distributing food packages upon patient discharge, running the eight-week Veggies for Health nutrition education program, and operating food pantries with fresh and non-perishable items available anytime. The program also features The Farm, a community garden for staff, and conducts food insecurity screenings.
- The Pathways Program at Swedish Hospital provides crucial support for patients experiencing domestic violence, human trafficking, and sexual assault, leveraging healthcare providers' roles to identify abuse and offer immediate support with safety planning, crisis intervention and advocacy at bedside. The program also links survivors to free trauma counseling and case management services on campus and provides connections to orders of protections and pro-bono legal representation through our community partners. Since its inception in 2015, Pathways has assisted over 2,650 patients, including 590 sexual assault survivors, and has trained 4,500 healthcare professionals.

Community Investment Fund

The Community Investment Fund is a dedicated resource aimed at fostering health and wellness, addressing social determinants of health and creating equitable access to quality healthcare within our community. By strategically allocating these funds, we support local initiatives, partnerships and non-profit organizations that respond to priority community health needs. In addition to financial support, we serve as a convener for community organizations, fostering a collaborative environment where the collective impact of our partnerships is greater than the sum of their parts.

- Hired new behavioral health provider who has supported 1000+ visits
- Training 16 behavioral health provider on DBT, to better provide trauma-informed care
- Created new electronic medical record workflows to track impact of behavioral health team

Partner since 2023, 1-year award, \$120,000



- Staffed two behavioral health counselors at Budlong Elementary school
- Seeing 14 students in one-on-one counseling
- Implemented new electronic medical record to better track and support clients and impact
- Establishing "Coffee with the Counselors" launching in March, 2024 - a way to make parents and teachers interacting with the clinicians more approachable, allowing them to gather over coffee and ask questions rather than sign up for one-on-one therapy, which might be intimidating
