- Pharmacists manage drug consults for the Antibiotic Pharmacokinetic Service and Anticoagulation
- Clinical pharmacists are decentralized, utilizing a unit-based practice model
- In-patient staff FTE: 17 Pharmacists, 4 Residents, and 16 Pharmacy Technicians
- Additional pharmacists work in the Infusion clinics (Galter oncology on campus and Niles specialty), outpatient pharmacies (GMP and FMP) on campus, and the anticoagulation (TAU) clinic on campus

Pharmacy Residency Purpose Statement

PGY1 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes to develop competent, experienced, acute care clinical pharmacists who are eligible for board certification and postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.

PGY1 Resident Qualifications

- Residents must be a graduate of an ACPE accredited Doctor of Pharmacy degree program
- Residents must be licensed or be eligible for pharmacist licensure in IL. Residents are expected to take the licensure board exams (NAPLEX and MPJE) prior to July 1 residency start.
- Residents shall participate in and obey the rules of the Residency Matching Program.

Submit the required information to PHORCAS by the deadline (early January): Curriculum Vitae and

- A Letter of Intent including a statement of professional goals and reasons for pursuing a PGY1
- Three Letter of Recommendation Forms
- Official transcript from an accredited School / College of Pharmacy
